PUTTING IT ALL ON THE LINE



Objective

The objective of the initiative is to provide Chapters across the state an array of options to fully engage in domestic violence awareness, education, and support work in the months leading up to the State Conference and within the scope of Z-HOPETM. The initiative culminates with a Clothesline Project Display during conference weekend.

Background

In one day, 702 victims of domestic violence were served in Maryland. Maryland Courts granted over 22, 000 Temporary Protective Orders and over 10,000 Final Protective Orders in Fiscal Year 2018. Even with the ongoing COVID-19 Pandemic, which made accessing and screening victims much more challenging, thousands of victims received services. *Maryland Network Against Domestic Violence www.mnadv.org*

Clothesline Project

The Clothesline Project is a visual display of shirts with graphic messages and illustrations that have been designed by women survivors of violence or allies. The purpose of the Project is to increase awareness of the impact of violence against women, to celebrate a woman's strength to survive and to provide another avenue for her to courageously break the silence that often surrounds her experience.

Activities And Criteria

Clothesline Display*	Bring t-shirts from t-shirt design event to conference for inclusion in Clothesline Display. *Chapters will be responsible for retrieving t-shirts following the display.	10 points per shirt (Minimum 5 required.
Safety & Security*	Submit a request to Ring for Non-Profits and obtain up to 60 ring devices and Ring Stick Up Cam devices to provide directly to survivors in your local service area. Teen Dating Violence 2023 Respect Week Challenge*	Zeta Youth ages 13-18 years old are encouraged to submit a 60 second PSA video on healthy relationships and the importance of respect and boundaries. Videos must be uploaded to YouTube (unlisted) and the link must be submitted via submission form at https://forms.gle/nPmimYtThrBV1CGo6 no later than 11:59pm on February 25, 2023.	25 points
Care Packages*	Care packages for women who have been displaced and or exiting abusive environments. See attached inventory sheet.	25 points for every 25 packages
Monetary Donations*	State Goal to raise \$2500 to help sponsor gas cards and emergency housing for domestic violence victims. Mobilize legislators to act!

The State of Maryland urges chapters and auxiliaries to draft letters in support of HB 4 / SB 0129 which seeks to protect women in abusive marriages by repealing the provision to prohibit the prosecution of a person for rape or a certain sexual offense against a victim who was the person's legal spouse at the time of the alleged rape or sexual offense.

Sample Letter Format

Office Address United States House of Representatives or United State Senate City, State, Zip code
My name is (your first and last name) and I am a (family member /service provider/advocate/community member) who resides in your district.
State why you are writing this letter or sending this email.
State your views to support or oppose the bill or other issue here. Choose up to three of the strongest points that support your position and state them clearly.
Tell your representative why the issue is important to you and how it affects you, your family member and your community. Use a personal story or personalize the issue. Avoid personal attacks, threats of political influence or demands.
Tell your representative how you want her or him to vote on this issue and ask for a response. If mailing a letter be sure to include your name and address on both your letter and envelope.

Please also ensure permission is granted to include selected shirts in the Clothesline Display. All submissions are anonymous to protect the creator. Shirts can be designed using words and or drawings.

Please ask survivors not to name their perpetrators by both the first and last name unless they have been convicted of that particular crime.
